#### **GENERAL INFORMATIONS**

• It should be noted that the audience will enter with the dancers on stage. We request that any public announcements be made beforehand in the lobby.

• Duration of the performance: 1 hour without intermission.

#### STAGE

Required dimensions :

- Width: 42' (13m)
- Depth: 42' (13m)
- Height: 20' (6m)

Dressing:

- No dressing
- Cyclorama in the background
- We will need two wings to close the sides of the cyclorama.

#### Floor/Stage:

• The performers dance directly on the stage floor, so we request a thorough cleaning of the stage for their safety.

• No dance mats can be used for the safety of the dancers.

#### SET

The set consists of:

- 1 cyclorama 40' wide by 20' high.
- 1 boom bar (see Plan Lx)

We request that the presenter provide:

• A white or cream-colored cyclorama for video projection, 40' wide.

• The cyclorama should be at least 32', ideally 40', to adequately cover the sides with the wings.

#### LIGHTING

The following inventory is subject to change based on the venue's inventory. Audience lighting must be controllable from the lighting console.

We request that the presenter provide:

- 111 dimmers
- 28 Leko variable focus 15/30
- 11 Leko variable focus 25/50
- 1 Leko 19-degree
- 8 Leko 26-degree
- 10 Leko 36-degree
- 19 Fresnel 1k
- 8 Fresnel 2k
- 29 PAR Wide
- 1 Aurora cyc 2 or equivalent
- 32 Floorbases
- 3 boom bases
- 3 pipes 3'-4''
- 3 pipes 12'

The company will have:

• 1 Laptop with ETC Nomad 1K + Gadget II (able to connect ArtNet, sACN, and/or 2 DMX universes);

#### SOUND

Sound is managed by the musician on stage.

The presenter must provide the following equipment:

• A main high-fidelity sound system suitable for the venue (minimum capacity of 96 dB(A) at the control desk).

- 4 monitors to cover the stage, mounted above the stage.
- Two balanced XLR inputs, Left and Right (the musician on stage will provide the feed).
- A table 3' x 4' with a minimum height of 3'.
- 1 Crown/AKG PCC 160 or PZM (or equivalent) microphone to amplify the performers (not necessary in small venues).

• If there is an arrangement for a public discussion after the performance, microphones should be provided to facilitate this.

The company will provide the following equipment:

- Mac laptop (Serato software)
- Roland DJ-808 console

#### **CONTROL BOOTH**

The lighting control is managed by the stage manager at the control booth. The sound and video control is managed on stage by the musician. A clear-com system is required both at the control booth and on stage.

The company will have:

• Mac Pro with QLab for video with HDMI port

#### DRESSING ROOMS AND COSTUME

The presenter must provide:

- 1 dressing room (men) for 2 people with chairs, counter, and mirrors.
- 1 dressing room (women) for 6 people with chairs, counter, and mirrors.
- Towels for 8 people.
- Costume rack in the dressing rooms.
- Green room with water, juice, and healthy snacks.
- Access to a washer and dryer.

#### PARKING

The presenter must provide parking for the company members' vehicles. The company strongly encourages its members to use eco-friendly transportation options to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, such as active transportation, public transit, and carpooling. Outside of the Greater Montreal area, we will likely arrive with a large van.

#### SETUP SCHEDULE

A pre-setup is requested, including pre-hanging and removal of the dressing, the day before Day 1.

- 3:00 PM to 5:30 PM Cue to Cue / Rehearsal
- 5:30 PM to 6:30 PM Dinner break
- 6:30 PM to 7:30 PM Show call
- 7:00 PM to 7:30 PM Dancers on stage
- 8:00 PM to 9:00 PM Performance
- 9:10 PM Strike
